Design Responsibility: Potentials and Pitfalls

at Kolding School of Design, Denmark

Design Responsibility: Potentials and Pitfalls – The 8th NORDCODE Seminar & Workshop will take place 27th to 29th of May 2009 in Kolding, Denmark. The seminar is organized and hosted by Kolding School of Design for the Nordic network for research on communicative product design (NORDCODE).

Seminar theme and topics

The overall theme of the seminar is the notion of design responsibility. Responsibility is by no means a clear-cut term in design or design research. Rather the notion reflects an ever growing attention to and critical thinking upon the effects of design — of conceptualizing, creating, producing, using and putting artifacts into the world. Design relates to issues of functionality, sustainability, ethics, aesthetics and signification — just to name a few. The aim of the seminar is to bring these issues into play and examine the potentials and pitfalls of design responsibility in connection to the communicative aspects of design. Further we would like to explore design aesthetics, research methodology, design processes, form experience and pleasure, and cultural and social signification of design. Questions of interest are:

- What does the notion of design responsibility entail for design research and design practice?
- How can design responsibility be used or be useful for designers and in design research?
- What is responsible design and what is not?
- How is responsibility communicated in design and design research?

We invite design researchers, professional designers, and other contributors to send in working papers on these, and related issues. We encourage contributions from theoretical and methodological as well as analytical and practical standpoints to identify and discuss the potentials or pitfalls regarding the notion of responsibility in design and for designers and researchers. Suggested topics for presentations are:

- Criteria for design
- · Ideology and design
- Discourse on design
- Ethics in design



Seminar

Each participant will give a 20-minute oral presentation, including a discussion of 10 minutes, based on the submitted working paper. Both paper and presentation should be in English. I addition, three keynote lectures will be given on the subject design responsibility and the communicative aspects of design. The Nordic network for research on communicative product design (NORDCODE) was initiated in 2000 by research colleagues of the department of Industrial Design Engineering at Chalmers University of Technology (in Gothenburg, Sweden) and of the "Meaning of Form" research group at the University of Art and Design Helsinki (TAIK), Finland. Since 2003, the network has held a series of successful seminars at Nordic design research institutions as well as a series of Nordic PhD courses.
