Description

The Nordic network for research on communicative product design (Nordcode) is an initiative of research colleagues of the department of Industrial Design Engineering at Chalmers University of Technology (in Gothenburg, Sweden) and of the "Meaning of Form" research group at the University of Art and Design Helsinki (UIAH), Finland.

The network was established in order to facilitate Nordic research collaboration specifically in the field of communicative product design. Biannual seminars function as the main discussion forums of the network, gathering together active researchers from the Nordic countries. The first Nordcode seminar was organised on March 10-11, 2003 in Gothenburg.

Seminar theme and focus

In accordance to the general topic - **"Semantic & aesthetic functions in design"** – the seminar continues the building of a platform for future co-operation, started in the first Nordcode seminar. The aim is to share opinions and discuss the underlying concepts of communicative product design from a Scandinavian perspective.

The seminar will be organized primarily around presentations of **working papers** illustrating various research approaches and topical research projects of the network members.

The seminar will take place on October 2nd and 3rd at the University of Art and Design Helsinki. Preceding the seminar, a **workshop** on *"Semantic & aesthetic functions in usability context"* will be arranged in the usability laboratory of the Helsinki University of Technology on October 1st. Guests can choose to participate both in the workshop and the seminar or only in the seminar.

Working papers and presentations

Working papers

The seminar will focus on the presentations and accompanying working papers of the participants. The working papers should be brief (2-3 pages) descriptions of research-in-progress. Conceptual papers concerning the topic of communicative product design are also welcomed, but the use of practical examples will be particularly encouraged. The working papers will be included in the seminar folder that will be delivered to participants at registration.

Presentations

The papers will be presented in the seminar. As estimated, there will be about 20 minutes arranged for each presentation.

Post-conference publication

On the basis of the working papers, authors will be asked to provide full academic papers (5-10 pages) that will be edited for a post-conference publication in the series F of the University of Art and Design Helsinki.

Preceding the seminar, a **workshop** on *"Semantic & aesthetic functions in usability context"* will be arranged in the usability laboratory of the Helsinki University of Technology on October 1st.

Due to practical reasons, the main workshop is limited to 12 persons (selected in order of registration). If more interested people appear, a parallel workshop will be arranged in relation to the conference theme.
