Seminar theme and focus

In accordance to the general topic "Design communication" – the seminar continues the building of a platform for future cooperation, started in the first two Nordcode seminars. The aim is to share opinions and to encourage and support research within communicative products design seen from a Nordic perspective.

Design is about communication in many dimensions. Designed objects communicate messages about aesthetic qualities and information about their use and usability. Also the design process is very much about communication. The design team communicates about design concepts and communication with users is central to ensure good design.

Topics include:

- Semantic and aesthetic functions How do products communicate? And how do designers communicate their thoughts about design intensions?
- User involvement How can users be involved in the design process?
- User centred design How can user requirements be handled in the design process?
- Conceptualization How can designers communicate early design ideas/concepts within a design team? And with potential consumers?

The seminar will be organised primarily around presentations of **working papers** illustrating various research approaches and topical research projects of the network members.

The seminar will take place on April 29th & 30th at the Technical University of Denmark. Preceding the seminar a **workshop** on "**Design communication experiments**" will be arranged at on April 28th. Guests can choose to participate either in the workshop and the seminar or only in the seminar.

The Nordcode network

The Nordic network for research on communicative product design (Nordcode) is an initiative of research colleagues of the department of Industrial Design Engineering at Chalmers University of Technology (in Gothenburg, Sweden) and the "Meaning of form" research group at the University of Art and Design Helsinki (UIAH), Finland, The Norwegian University of Science and Technology, Trondheim, Norway and the Department of Mechanical Engineering (MEK) and the Department of Manufacturing Engineering and Management (IPL) at the Technical University of Denmark, Lyngby, Denmark.

The network was established in order to facilitate Nordic research collaboration specifically in the field of communicative product design. Biannual seminars function as the main discussion forums of the network, gathering together active researchers from the Nordic countries. The first two Nordcode seminars were organised on March 10-11, 2003 in Gothenburg and on October 1-3, 2003 in Helsinki.

Working papers

The seminar will focus on the presentations and the accompanying working papers of the participants. The working papers should be brief (2-3 pages) description of research in progress. Conceptual papers concerning the topic of communicative product design are also welcomed, but the use of practical examples will be particularly encouraged. The working papers will be displayed at the Nordcode homepage and included in the seminar folder that will be delivered to the participants at registration.

Presentations

The papers will be presented at the seminar. As estimated, there will be about 20 minutes arranged for each presentation (including questions).

Post-conference publication

On the basis of the working papers, authors will be asked to provide full academic papers (5-10 pages) that will be reviewed and edited for a post-conference publication from the Technical University of Denmark.
